




Exciting months








A New Way Of Learning

Online teaching has been successful and gratifying


The first quarter of online teaching has been successful and gratifying for me as a teacher. Students have adapted beautifully into what is the new normal for this 2020 school year.






























What is going on in the world

AWAKENING IN CHILDREN THE LOVE FOR OUR COUNTRY

During this 2nd Quarter in History and Geography of Venezuela we tried to promote the national identity in our students so they prepared a special project called "INDIGENOUS CULTURAL APPORTS" which was accompanied by a series of activities that promote active, collaborative and experiential learning, which contribute to the strengthening of the feeling of belonging. During the project, students had the opportunity to learn about the different cultural contributions made by the original inhabitants of the territory and that today are part of our daily life, from the construction of state, urban and municipal buildings, to gastronomic elements such as casabe and arepa, the survival of the pre-Hispanic in the current traditional crafts, among others.

ven if we are facing difficult times we can always find a way to learn and make things different. During these months my main goal was to teach my students in a way they could feel there's always something new that we can learn or practice.

They learned that technologies, computers, communications, internet are good but sometimes we don't explore all the tools they can provide us, so we got deeper into the world of Google Search, trying to use all the tools that the G Suite provides us, learning about the way technologies are affecting our culture by using different platforms, games and dynamics. At the end they could practice and refresh their knowledge with a little extra information.

























Creative thinking activities: In arts, we focused on motivating, stimulating and supporting the student's potential. Their work is a reflection of their ideas, fantasies and personal imagination. In recent experiences we tried different exercises, involving sensory stimulation: tactile and visual textures, which brought the creator in this case the students to know other extra-pictorial resources such as sawdust, colored sand, paper, corrugated cardboard and others, so that with its reuse we contributed to have a better planet and at the same time, they had the opportunity to explore their artistic potential and many possibilities presented by nature with its raw material of infinite use!



Virtual Science **Fair**

Science fair is an opportunity for students to apply the scientific method to conduct independent research. The students have to choose a scientific question he or she would like to answer. Then, library and Internet research on the question give the student the background information he or she needs to formulate a hypothesis and design an experiment.

After writing a report to summarize this research, the student performs the experiment, draws his or her conclusions, and presents the results to teachers and classmates

What makes a science fair project such a great learning experience is that it involves so much more than science and the students are actively involved in the learning process. Our CELM students enjoyed doing this project and each of them did a wonderful job. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we had to do this year's science fair virtually. It was a different and wonderful experience for all of us.

Work hard for the things you want!

1.-How long have you been working at CELM?

Well I have been working at CELM for two school years. Since 2019, as the school's Coordinator.
