
Map Tests from NWEA

The Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is a suite of assessments that deliver data you need to make a difference in student progress, is a tool that is going to help teachers diagnose which are each student's weaknesses and strengths, so teaching can be specialized and differentiated in each classroom.

Measuring-Reading-Math-Language Arts

MAP Growth uses the RIT (Rasch Unit) scale to help you measure and compare academic growth. Specifically, the scale measures levels in academic difficulty. The RIT scale extends equally across all grades, making it possible to compare a student's score at various points throughout his or her education.

What does a specific RIT score mean? It represents the level where a student is ready to learn, also known as the Zone of Proximal Development. The test finds that level by pinpointing where a student would just as likely answer incorrectly as correctly, the point between knowing and not knowing answers.

PARENTS ARE AN IMPORTANT ELEMENT FOR THE MAP TESTS

TO PREPARE YOUR KIDS FOR TESTING

1. Meet with your child's teacher as often as needed to discuss his or her progress. Ask about activities you and your child can do at home to help prepare for tests and improve your child's understanding of schoolwork. Parents and teachers working together benefits students.

2. Provide a quiet, comfortable place for studying at home without distractions from TV or electronic devices.

3. Make sure that your child is well rested on school days and especially the day of a test. Children who are tired are less able to pay attention in class or handle the demands of a test.

4. Give your child a well-rounded diet. A healthy body leads to a healthy, active mind.



Doing experiments in class, look at their reaction!

Second graders had the opportunity to do an experiment in class. They were really happy having this experience. Let's check their reaction to the experiment.

fter studying measuring tools and measuring units, we did an experiment in class. From all the measuring tools, students chose measuring cups and thermometers and decided to fill all the cups with water at different temperature, cold water, hot water and room temperature water.

Then, with the thermometer they measured the different water temperature in the different cups. Students had to identify and read all measuring units correctly.

After this, students added food coloring in the different cups with different water temperature to see how the food coloring reacted to each.

In normal water, the food coloring dissolves slowly, in hot water, the food coloring dissolves right away and quickly mixes in with the water, and in the cold water the food coloring freezes while it goes down to the bottom making little strings of color in the water.



STUDENTS REACTIONS TO THE EXPERIMENT

Carlotta: "The experiment was really cool, because I saw that in cold water the food coloring freezes while it reaches the bottom" I really enjoyed it.

PauLa: "The science experiment was very fun. I liked doing the experiment with normal water temperature because I could see the reaction of the food coloring. The food coloring took some time to dissolve, rather than in hot water that it dissolves immediately. I really enjoyed it."

Salvatore: "The food coloring in cold water is slow and it freezes while it goes down, the food coloring in hot water dissolves faster. I had a lot of fun."

During this first quarter, they have done science projects with a lot of energy, completed social studies activities with maps, and learnt how to efficiently write getting inspiration from writing prompts.




















Upper School was part of a T-exposition, they presented innovative technology resources to their classmates







how George Orwell used the characters in Animal Farm to criticize the Revolution.




